























ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2018



L'OREAL Middle East Program "Beauty for a Better Life"

The "Beauty for a Better Life" program is an initiative launched by L'OREAL Middle East to provide free and certified training courses for vulnerable women. L'OREAL Middle East approached DFWAC to deliver this program for woman victims of abuse and violence, the program aims to help them regain their self-confidence and break the cycle of violence as well as reintegrating them in the community.




Extension and expansion of the "Women Empowerment program" with the "Union Coop"

Union Coop launched this initiative in 2017 to support DFWAC clients to develop a variety of skills, improve their living conditions and encourage them to become financially independent by managing small businesses. In 2018, this initiative was renewed and expanded to include empowerment programs for abused children by providing training courses to enhance their personal, psychological, social and academic skills.



Construction of a children's villa funded by HSBC bank

HSBC has sponsored and supported the construction of the new children's villa with a capacity of 25 children. This project aims to provide a better sheltering services for children victims of violence and abuse in accordance with the best care standards.



Display DFWAC Data on the Smart Statistics System of the Dubai Statistics Center

DFWAC successfully displayed its data and statistics in the Dubai Statistics Center dashboard to be viewed by the decision makers in a smart effective way.



Launching the second phase of Anti Bullying Program at schools

DFWAC conducted 48 workshops about anti bullying in 2018, and an estimate of 1304 students, parents and school personal benefited from these workshops. In addition, DFWAC participated in the first and second (National Bullying Prevention Week) that was held under the patronage of Her Highness Sheikha Fatima Bint Mubarak, Chair of the General Women's Union, President of the Supreme Council for Motherhood and Childhood and Supreme Chairwoman of the Family Development Foundation. Moreover, DFWAC organized a major event at Lego Land Dubai on the International Children's Day. This event included educational games and activities to teach students important techniques to face bullying behaviors such as sympathy, tolerance, respect and responsibility.



Raising Awareness Among Most Vulnerable Group to Human Trafficking

In 2018 and for the fourth year, DFWAC distributed around (7400) human trafficking awareness brochures in Dragon Mart and International City in 10 different languages to increase the community awareness about such crime.

Organizing the "Embassies Meeting"

In collaboration with Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, a meeting was held with representatives from the Embassies countries having the highest rate of human trafficking victims. The aim of this meeting was to raise awareness of the crime and introduce the services provided by various entities to protect, care and rehabilitate the victims.



Participation in the (United Campaign to End Violence Against Women 2018) for the 4th year respectively

The campaign runs for 16 days from 25 February 2018 until 10 December 2018 in line with "International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women" which is known as the Orange Day. The campaign included a number of training workshops and lectures to the employees, clients and partners of the foundation to enhance woman self-confidence and to strengthen their personal protection plans.

Organizing the annual campaign for childhood Protection for the ninth year

DFWAC organized its annual campaign under the slogan "don't underestimate the power of dad" which aims to strengthen the role and responsibility of fathers in addition to highlighting the consequences of child neglect.
